On-Site Trainings

Virtual Trainings

If you request a virtual training, you will be required to register a minimum of 8 participants in order to take the training.

Please read carefully before proceeding or registering for a specific course!

- → For all courses held virtually, a stable internet connection is required along with a laptop, tablet or computer that has a functional camera and microphone. It is recommended to download Zoom and ensure the application is up-to-date PRIOR to your scheduled training. You can download a free version of Zoom by visiting: https://zoom.us/. If you do not wish to download Zoom, it is recommended that you utilize Google Chrome to join the platform. All registered participants will receive a Zoom link via email after payment has been rendered.
- → All assessments will be provided proceeding the close of each course. Assessments are electronic via Google Form. A Google account is NOT needed in order to complete an assessment. You will be notified via email of pass/fail communication and provided a certificate for assessments scoring 75% or higher. The full name you provide on the Google form will be the name that will appear on your certificate and the certificate will go to the email address you provide on the Google form, as well. Please always double check these fields before submitting.

FOR GROUP REGISTRATION (8+ participants):

- In order to secure your training date, we require a non-refundable \$50 deposit. You will receive a personal PayPal link in order to pay your deposit. Once a payment for the deposit is made, your training date will be secured.
- The final cost of your training will be based on the number of participants you provide at the time of the deposit. Due to costs for preparing for your training, you will not receive a refund for participants who do not show on the day of the event.
- Electronic payments must be rendered within 48 hours leading up to the learning event. Participant count can be adjusted no later than 5 business days prior to the learning event. (Ex. if an event is held on a Friday, you will have up until the previous Thursday to adjust your participant count).
- Physical checks must be received 5 business days prior to the scheduled learning event based on the final participant count discussed above. Mailing address is located on the PayPal invoice.

FOR INDIVIDUAL REGISTRATION:

FOR ALL TYPES OF REGISTRATION:

- Participants arriving 15 minutes late may be admitted however they will not receive a certificate, credit, or refund. This will be determined at the discretion of the Instructor.
- Participants MUST receive a satisfactory pass score of 75% which is required to receive a certificate.
- Certificates may be either mailed or emailed at the conclusion of each training. Receiving certificates ensures that the participant has met the training objective and gained the knowledge. Replacement certificates for personal use and disclosure will cost \$10 per certificate.

Cancellation Policy: All payments need to be made in full prior to the start of a course. Each learning event, whether Face-to-Face or webinar format, requires a minimum of eight participants. The decision to hold or cancel a class is made, in most cases, three business days prior to class. 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BASIC HEALTH & SAFETY AND BREASTFEEDING AWARENESS

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This 3 hour course has been developed to provide information about critical health and safety topics for all child care providers. Information provided is basic, aligned to current regulations along with various resources for ensuring the health, safety and welfare of children while in child care.

This course costs \$32 per participant.

PREREQUISITES:

There are no prerequisites required for completing this course.

HOURS BREAKDOWN:

0.3 IACET CEUs or 3 Core of Knowledge Hours: Health, Safety and Nutrition-3

COURSE LOGISTICS, MATERIALS & EQUIPMENT:

This course is offered in-person and virtually.

- <u>Virtual</u>: A laptop, computer or tablet that includes a functional camera, microphone and headphones/speaker is required in order to complete this course virtually. A phone device is not acceptable. A Powerpoint Handout will be provided to each participant via email prior to their scheduled course.
- <u>In-Person</u>: A Powerpoint Handout will be provided to each registered participant. Participants should bring a pen or pencil for note taking.

The Instructor will utilize Powerpoint slides and speech to present the content material. A variety of videos, charts and tables may be utilized to demonstrate content ideas and concepts.

LEARNING OUTCOMES/OBJECTIVES:

Participants will gain knowledge, awareness and skills in the following key areas:

- 1. Prevention and control of infectious diseases;
- 2. Administration of medication, consistent with standards for parental consent;
- 3. Prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions, and care of asthma;
- 4. First aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR);
- 5. Prevention of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and use of safe sleeping practices;
- 6. Prevention of Shaken Baby Syndrome and abusive head trauma Child Abuse and Neglect;
- 7. Building and physical premises safety, including identification of and protection from hazards that can cause bodily injury such as electrical hazards, bodies of water, and vehicular traffic (outdoor safety and supervision);
- 8. Handling and storage of hazardous materials and the appropriate disposal of bio-contaminants;
- 9. Appropriate precautions in transporting children, if applicable;
- 10. Emergency preparedness and response planning.

Participants' knowledge will be assessed through a Post-Assessment via Google Form and the Google Form link will be provided to each participant immediately following a course. The assessment will include multiple choice and/or matching questions to test comprehension. - 6. Describe how to select the appropriate ASQ using a case study.
- 7. Explain how to score ASQ-3 areas and where to transfer information
- 8. Discuss the ASQ-3 score interpretation and recommended follow-up
- 9. Describe the features of ASQ Online
- 10. Describe ways to use family friendly language when using various forms of communication.

11. Discuss ways to introduce to caregivers and parents how to use various forms of communication such as newsletters, presentations.

12. Discuss the cultural considerations when communicating with parents and screening of children.

13. Emphasize that this tool is not used to diagnose but instead using this information helps provide/resources for families.

They will also discuss equity and identity, as well as the difference between it and equality by reviewing and discussing real-life scenarios that involve issues of equity in ECE.

This 3 hour module explores the science of implicit bias and how implicit bias shows up in daily life, and provides opportunities to practice strategies that interrupt implicit bias. This session emphasizes the impact of microaggressions and stereotypes that influence teaching and learning while working with children and families. Participants will engage with content that leads them to a common understanding of implicit bias and reflect on their own bias and that of others. Research studies involving bias and strategies to address bias in the workplace will be shared.

The entire Developing Equity in Early Childhood Education series costs \$120 per participant for all four modules. These modules cannot be purchased separately and must be taken consecutively.
